On a 20-year timescale, methane, a potent greenhouse gas, is 84 times more potent than carbon dioxide. The composting process significantly reduces these emissions.

At-home composting can decrease trash pick-up frequency.

Food Composting Options:

Food waste pick-up companies. If home composting won't work for you, the chart below lists local companies that will pick up your food scraps at your home twice a month. You can compare the services and incentives they offer. The food scraps are taken to Linvilla Orchards to be made into compost for participants and local farms.
